Our Middle/High School campus faces several challenges. The Fr. Pat Delahunty Gymnasium is 50 years old and structurally sound, but it lacks air conditioning and ample space. The gym is inadequate to serve all practice and game requirements and extracurricular activities. Therefore, it has become an obstacle in our efforts to serve our students and attract new ones. Our award-winning band program has experienced exponential growth, expanding beyond its current practice and storage area. We also intend to grow our choral and drama programs.


THE TIME IS NOW! To serve present and future students while furthering our mission, we must all come together and continue building for the future. To ensure this future, we need to act now!

CPS stakeholders evaluated our needs to assess our school's strengths, challenges, and opportunities through a nine-month strategic planning process. Our goal was to identify what is required to best serve our students – today and in the future. With input from faculty, students, parents, priests, alumni, and archdiocesan leadership, we identified key objectives necessary to continue MCPS's tradition of excellence.

The next step was to seek the feedback of our supporters. In February and March, we conducted a planning study to measure the level of support for our proposed projects. The positive response to the study indicates strong support for a capital campaign that will focus on two major enhancements to our Middle/High School campus. As a result, we are beginning Building on Faith, Family and Tradition! - a \$3.5+ million capital campaign. The \$6.5 million project will be funded by this capital campaign, our continuing capital assessment fees, and an accompanying loan.



NEW GYMNASIUM | \$5,620,000

Our new gym will be approximately 35,000 square feet with a seating capacity of 800. Two basketball courts will double our current playing space and allow us to host tournaments. This new gym will have a much needed climate controlled environment, greatly increasing the comfort of our athletes and attendees. This space will also include a fully-

equipped weight room, concession area, offices, locker rooms, and a multipurpose area that will be used for reviewing sports film, a faculty/staff meeting room and a hosting space for various school events.




CONVERSION OF FR. PAT DELAHUNTY GYMNASIUM INTO DEDICATED PERFORMING ARTS AREA | \$880,000

Converting the current gymnasium will enhance our entire performing arts program. First, this area will be completely remodeled, including proper climate control! Second, it will create

critically needed practice, storage, and office space for our highly regarded band program. More space means students will be able to better focus on all aspects of their practice. Third, it will increase the breadth of our performing arts program to include a state-of-the-art choral/drama classroom. This will allow us to provide a vibrant and supportive environment for current and

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future students with an affinity for the performing arts.



In order to conduct a successful capital campaign and achieve these goals, Montgomery Catholic will rely heavily upon the generosity of school families, past parents, alumni, administration, grandparents, faculty, staff, pastors, the business community, and other community supporters. Please consider making a sacrificial gift for our efforts in making Montgomery Catholic a stronger and brighter environment for our students and the community. Montgomery Catholic is proposing a three-year pledge period, and the following chart is provided as a guide as you prayerfully consider your gift or pledge.







Methods of Giving

Selecting the best gift plan depends on your personal financial situation and goals. As tax laws are always changing and each individual's situation is different, supporters are encouraged to consult with financial advisers to determine their most beneficial contribution method.

Pledges are commitments made in good faith but are not legally binding. We encourage you to consider stretching pledges over a three-year period to maximize the total amount of your support. This commitment can be fulfilled through monthly, quarterly, semiannual, or annual installments.

GIFTS MADE BY CASH OR CHECK are the most common and will have an immediate impact on the cost of the projects. However, we will gratefully accept gifts in various forms, including those described here:

CREDIT CARD - gifts made with a credit card provide a detailed record of your charitable donations for tax purposes and allow you to build "rewards" points.

SECURITIES - a gift of stocks, bonds and mutual funds can often be an advantageous form of giving.

REAL ESTATE - gifts of real property are entitled to an income tax deduction equal to the full market value with no tax on any capital gain.

Please remember that payments on pledges are deductible for income tax purposes as provided by law.
